Program Details

Schedule & Coursework

All SASLI classes take place during the eight-week summer session, running from mid-June through mid-August. Classroom instruction will be scheduled for four hours per day, Monday through Friday. All SASLI students are expected to attend class daily.

Students registering for SASLI are required to select one South Asian language for study. Languages offered vary from year to year. Limited distance learning opportunities may be available.

Credits

The schedule will enable students to complete two intensive semester courses, equivalent to one academic year of study. Students will receive a total of 8 credits from the University of Wisconsin-Madison for the SASLI summer session.

Costs

SASLI Tuition and Fees

The SASLI program includes the cost of tuition and university segregated fees. It does not include the cost of textbooks, living expenses, or records fee. Invoices will be issued electronically from the University of Wisconsin-Madison Bursar’s Office and should be paid in full by the deadline.

Housing and Living Costs

SASLI students are responsible for making their own living arrangements in Madison for the duration of the summer session and for all living costs incurred during their stay. Students may elect to live on campus in residence halls or in off-campus housing. Many meal options are available. Pro-rated student health insurance is available for the summer session for those who are interested.
