ADVANTAGES OF STUDYING ABROAD AT UW-MADISON

Earn In-Residence Credit

You'll earn in-residence credit for all courses taken abroad, which is recorded on your transcript and becomes part of your UW-Madison GPA. Participants of programs offered in partnership with the College of Engineering are granted pass/fail credit.

Stay Continuously Enrolled

You'll maintain your student status and keep your place in line for housing and class registration when you return from studying abroad.

Options for All Majors

We offer programs for students of all majors, not just students studying languages or world cultures. In fact, the top ten majors for study abroad participation include Political Science (#1), Biology, and Economics.

Program Variety

Choose from over 260 programs in more than 65 countries, many of which are taught in English! You can study abroad during the summer, semester, year, winter intersession, or spring break, and select programs that incorporate field work, research, internships, and service learning opportunities abroad.

Scholarships & Financial Aid

Apply for a wide range of need- or merit-based scholarships and learn about our Pre-Departure Loan program on our website. Financial aid can even be applied to most programs!

Program Support

Our Peer Advisors and professional staff are available to assist you before, during, and after your program. Orientations cover important information, including health & safety, logistics abroad, and host country details. We work closely with contacts on-site to provide assistance during your program.

Health & Safety

Students have access to CISI insurance, online resources, and in-person health and safety sessions. In addition, a study abroad staff member is accessible 24-hours a day in case of emergency.

Returned Student Resources

Explore resources to integrate your experiences abroad into the classroom and workplace back home.

Graduate Abroad

Many programs allow you to graduate abroad! Meet with your advisor to see if this is an option for you.


Regardless of the advising office you work with, our advising team is here to guide you throughout your study abroad experience, from choosing a program, to supporting you abroad and upon return!

FUNDING STUDY ABROAD

Study abroad costs vary depending on a number of factors, including duration, location, and program structure. Sometimes studying abroad is no more expensive than studying on campus.



FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid can be applied towards most of our programs. Start by completing a FAFSA application and meeting with the Office of Student Financial Aid.



BUDGETING

Determine your budget using our worksheet online & research programs to identify options that meet your budget.



GLOBAL GATEWAY

Students with high financial need may be eligible for our fully-funded summer programs or \$10,000 fellowships for semester and year-long programs.



SCHOLARSHIPS

Apply for merit & need based awards through our office, campus departments, and community organizations.

All students are eligible for \$1,500-4,000 Study Abroad Scholars awards.



INFO SESSIONS

Attend a funding info session offered regularly throughout the year. Check our website for upcoming sessions and financial aid drop-in advising.



PRE-DEPARTURE LOAN

Utilize our pre-departure loan to assist with paying for flights and the acceptance deposit.
